PRESIDENT'S report

It is my pleasure to report that 2015 was a positive year with steady progress for Badminton New Zealand.

The Board of Badminton New Zealand has had a productive year. At the first meeting after last year's AGM, Michelle Hollands was unanimously voted in as Chair for another year and she has continued to bring solid leadership to the board. We welcomed Ed Shuttleworth and Stephen Nelson as newly elected members and Doug McCaughley as an appointed member, however due to unforeseen circumstances Doug resigned two months later. The board has since appointed Danny Chan as a replacement through until 2017. He comes with vast governance experience and connections to the commercial sector in New Zealand that we have not had before.

Board meeting attendance between AGM's have been myself (6), Michelle Hollands (6), Delwyn Cooper (5), Danny Chan (4/4), Ed Shuttleworth (5) (one by phone), Mary Gardiner (5), Stephen Nelson (6), and Nigel Skelt (5) (2 of these have been brief attendances by Skype). Due to the difficulties of having board members attend via electronic means, the board recently resolved not to allow this in the future, requiring board members to attend in person.

One of the major items we have deliberated upon is the constitutional review. Although we had hoped to have this at the point of putting it to the members at the 2016 AGM

we did not feel the review was sufficiently complete to do so. Upcoming forums should go a long way with regard to concluding this important matter.

On the badminton front, it has been pleasing to see a new national events strategy rolled out. The changes have had immediate success in event entries and the events structure is better for host Associations.

I have watched with interest the emergence of the junior performance programme, with aims to take our highest performing youth and prepare them for future international success. This has involved over 100 players and produced a team that competed in the BWF World Junior Championships in Peru where they finished 29th out of 40 teams. Given the young age of the players and that this is our first time participating in many years, this was a creditable performance and bodes very well for the future.

It is notable that our audited accounts show a loss for the first time for 5 or 6 years. The figure is small (nearly \$8,000) especially in the context of our total revenue which, has increased from over \$600,000 to nearly \$1 million. Furthermore, with extra investment by Badminton New Zealand into our performance programme but with no government assistance, this was always going to cramp things up somewhat. So all things considered this is a pleasing result.

I want to congratulate Joe for the incredible job he does as our Chief Executive. After several staff losses he has rebuilt a good team around him that will be very effective for the coming year. I also acknowledge the success he has had in attracting significant funding into our sport, firstly from the Community Sport Investment Programme through Sport NZ for \$290,000 per year for four years, and also Major Events Funding for the SKYCITY Badminton New Zealand Open totalling \$185,000 over two years. The effort required to apply for these was huge and he has been well rewarded for our sport and this shows the growing level of confidence these agencies have in us as an organisation.

Recently, I was playing badminton at the Te Puke badminton club, which is run by a personal friend, and it reminded me of the huge amount of effort that goes into fostering our game at grassroots level right throughout the country.

Presenting trophies at our national junior events and attending the SKYCITY NZ Open was great for seeing the passion for our sport in players and spectators. Attending the BWF AGM in China and the Sudirman Cup opened my eyes to the enormous scope of our game worldwide. It is such a privilege to be involved on so many levels.

I finish by saying a huge thank you to Michelle Hollands who came on our board 5 plus years ago and has been Chair for the past four years. Her contribution has been very significant and has been a big part of our success. We will miss her professionalism and winsome manner that she used to pull our board together into a formidable team.

Chairperson & Chief executive's report

2015 has been a great year as we continue to work with our partners to grow badminton across New Zealand. The work of Badminton New Zealand involves supporting our game from grassroots participation through to high performance on the world stage. This is a large scope for a small organisation, but we are proud of the results we have achieved on and off the court in 2015.

Key highlights in 2015 include:

- Successful hosting of the 2015 X-TRM Oceania Senior and Junior Individual and Junior Team Championships at North Harbour. This included Oceania individual titles for Oscar Guo in the Boy's Singles and Nicco Tagle and Daxxon Vong in the Boys Doubles. New Zealand also placed second and third in the team championships.
- Continued success with the BWF Coach Education pathway with 12 coaches completing the Level 1 course in 2015. Another 152 community coaches completed either the Shuttle Time Tutors course or the Badminton New Zealand Community Coach qualification.
- Shuttle Time continues as a successful development programme with increases in the quality of delivery of the programme. This has seen more schools and more teachers engaged and completing the programme in 2015.
- Success in partnering with member associations to access KiwiSport funding of badminton projects. This has included exciting new partnership projects with Hutt Valley, Wellington North, Wellington, Canterbury and Hawke's Bay.
- Established the new Under 15 Badminton Test Series between New Zealand and Australia for the first time in Sydney in June. Eight players competed to win both test matches and all individual events.
- Welcomed three new members (Ed Shuttleworth, Danny Chan and Stephen Nelson) to the Board of Badminton New Zealand.
- Completion of a new draft strategic plan for Badminton New Zealand 2016 – 2020.
- Successful delivery of the SKYCITY New Zealand Badminton Open at a Grand Prix Gold level for the first time. This premier event included 256 players from 22 countries who competed in front of thousands of spectators and millions of households through the international TV coverage.
- Completion of business case models for a potentially new tiered association model of affiliation to Badminton New Zealand.

- Successful implementation of the new national event structure that has seen the individual and team competitions split into separate events. This has seen increases in participation in event entries in NZU13 (56% increase), NZU15 (22% increase) and NZU17 (2% increase).
- Continued growth of the Badminton New Zealand Junior Performance Programme that included more than 100 promising players from around the country. This important programme is supported by our new performance coaching group that includes five key national squad coaches.
- New Zealand competed at the BWF World Junior Championships in Peru finishing 29th out of 40 teams.
- Nina Kersten won a Silver Medal in the Women's Doubles at the BWF Para-Badminton World Championships in England.
- Shane and Maria Masinipeni won the 2015 New Caledonia International Mixed Doubles.
- Maria Masinipeni won the 2015 New Caledonia International Women's Doubles.
- Badminton New Zealand Technical Officials continue to achieve at high levels internationally. This included Trish Gubb who represented NZ as an official at the BWF World Badminton Championships in Jakarta, Indonesia, including selection as the umpire for the Men's Singles Final. Another highlight was Julie Carrel's appointment as the BWF Technical Delegate to the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games.
- Continued growth in our connection and engagement with commercial partners and new funders.
- Successful in increasing the Community Sport Investment from Sport New Zealand to Badminton New Zealand by 152% from \$115,000 PA to \$290,00 PA for the next four years.

A tremendous amount of work goes into achieving these key results and it is important to recognize the staff of Badminton New Zealand, the Board of Badminton New Zealand, our key volunteers and convenors, our 25 member associations and the wider badminton community. As we head into another exciting year in 2016 we look forward to working with our stakeholders and partners to inspire Kiwis to love badminton for life.

2016 will be another busy year for the Badminton New Zealand Events Team, starting off in February with the Oceania Team Championships at North Harbour in February, followed by the Maurice's Pools and Spas Waikato International and the SKYCITY New Zealand Open in March.

Following on from the success of the New Zealand Age Group Inter-association Championships in Palmerston North last year, we are predicting that we will see increased entries and player numbers exceed 500. This is a large event with 36 courts being utilised; a very rewarding event to see so many young players on the courts enjoying their badminton.

There has been a significant amount of work being done behind the scenes in conjunction with the management company for the 2017 World Masters Games. Another "first"; we have included Para Badminton – 4 classes, in the games. The registration system went live mid-February and we are confident that badminton will exceed our target numbers.

Seniors Division One and Two – Wisden and Slazenger Cups:

Waitakere 1 just won the Wisden Cup for the 3rd year in a row, after winning an 8 match all, 18-16 games tie against Waikato. Canterbury were outplayed in all ties so they return back to Slazenger for 2016. In Slazenger, Wellington North won all 5 ties and are promoted to Wisden Cup next year and Waikato 2 came out 6th after 3 teams only won 1 tie each, so is relegated to Division 3 for 2016.

Seniors Division Three – New Zealand Final

Waitakere 3 defeated Otago 1 to win the NZ Seniors Division 3. Waitakere now have 2 teams in Seniors Div 2 for 2016

Seniors North Island Division Five

With only 6 teams entered (same as 2014) , this was run as 1 x pool with all teams playing each other. This only gave each team 5 ties for the season

Seniors South Island Division 3

7 teams played in pools of 4 and 3 for the 1st weekend with knockout finals played in the 2nd weekend. Otago 1 won this Division for the 2nd year in a row

Masters and Veterans North and South Island

Still the most popular categories with no major issues. Masters North Island Divisions 1 to 4 each played as a pool of 9 teams Masters North Island Division 5 was split into a northern zone of 6 teams playing a total of 5 ties over 3 x weekends and a southern zone of 5 teams playing 4 ties over 2 weekends with play offs in the 4th weekend. Veterans North Island Divisions 1 to 3 each played as a pool of 9 teams Veterans North Island Division 4 had 7 teams playing 7 ties in Zone A and 6 teams playing 5 ties in Zone B with play offs. Masters South Island Divisions 1 and 2 played as a pool of 6 teams Masters South Island Division 3 played as a pool of 5 teams.

Development

Growing and developing badminton at the grassroots is a key component of the work of Badminton New Zealand. To do this successfully we depend heavily on the partnerships we have with associations. By working together through the national framework of development programmes we have seen strong results in 2015. The essence of the Badminton New Zealand development initiatives have been based around the BWF Shuttle Time and Coach Education Level 1.

Badminton New Zealand has been very impressed with the Shuttle Time programme. The general concept of giving every child a chance to play badminton is a very achievable within the framework that is submitted through this programme.

As with all National Sports Organisations, delivery models vary from region to region. Badminton New Zealand is very thankful for the BWF in allowing us to adapt the Shuttle Time programme to suit the needs of our communities. Badminton Oceania has also stepped up as a key partner with this programme and has provided added expertise and value.

It is exciting to see the number of children accessing a quality Shuttle Time experience in 2015. Although this number has slightly reduced over this period this has been due to the increase in required quality and number of sessions for participants in the programme. Shuttle Time provides a springboard for children interested in badminton and it is critical that they have a positive experience.

More and more associations are engaging and delivering the Shuttle Time programme and are seeing the benefits of an internationally recognized development initiative.

Badminton New Zealand would like to thank our Associations, Badminton Oceania and the BWF for their continued support in the delivery of Shuttle Time. We are looking forward to the 2016 year where we aim to make the programme grow amongst our communities.

The BWF Level 1 Coach Education Course was held over two weekends in 2015. The course was delivered as per the guidelines from BWF and participants were led through a series of practical and theoretical modules. In addition participants completed the practical and theoretical exam as well as log books of coaching activity between weekends.

The course was well attended with 12 participants from around New Zealand. In comparison to 2014, the 2015 course had less candidates register and attend. The final number of 12 coaches was designed to ensure that coaches had enough interaction with the tutor and each other. This worked well and has informed best practice for the future. Badminton New Zealand also delivered a resit to 4 participants from 2014. In total we achieved 12 registrations and 12 completed and passed coaches as well as passing 4 coaches from 2014.

BWF material is of a high quality and provides an important foundation for learning. The coaches were all engaged in the course and showed a good ability to cope with the workload that the course offered. A strong focus on mentoring coaches is an important added value

piece to this qualification. This mentoring process allows the tutor to be satisfied that coaches are on track.

The coaches on this course have shown that badminton playing ability is not always the most important characteristic when participating in the course, therefore promotion of wider inclusion is important in the future. We need to build a stronger base for BWF Level 1 and Badminton New Zealand is excited to be working at progressing coaches through to BWF Level 2 Coach Education in 2016.

2015 also saw exciting developments in the 'Girls in Badminton' project with an in depth report being produced on the motivating factors behind successful participation in girls in badminton. This full report is now available across the New Zealand sport sector and to associations.

A key development space that Badminton New Zealand will be working on in 2016 will be Para Badminton. With it's inclusion in the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Games and the fantastic opportunities Para Badminton provides for people with a disability, this is an area that requires additional focus and emphasis.

PERFORMANCE

High performance is a key component of the work of Badminton New Zealand and 2015 saw an increased focus in this area. A clearly defined and supported high performance pathway provides structure for players and coaches to follow. Badminton New Zealand is committed to building this pathway with the support of our Associations.

Led by Badminton New Zealand National Coach Peter Jensen, the high performance programme has continued to build on the foundations set last year. This has included a strong focus on junior performance programmes and pathways with the NZ Under 15 and NZ Under 19 Squads and Teams. For the first time Badminton New Zealand delivered an annual performance plan for junior players and this ground work has established the start of a high performance culture for our next generation of players.

Critical to the high performance programme has been the involvement and expertise provided by the group of coaches that lead our national squads and teams. Tracey Hallam has been an exciting addition to the team in 2015 and as a former Commonwealth Games Gold Medallist understands what it takes to win on the world stage.

Robbie Thackham, Sandra Lynch and Brent Miller continue to contribute significantly not only through the high performance programmes but also in linking into the development programmes of Shuttle Time and BWF Coach Education Level 1.

Innovation is an important consideration for Badminton New Zealand with the limited resources we have in the high performance

programme. It was exciting to see that through our partnership with Badminton Australia that a Test Match and development opportunity was provided to our top NZ Under 15 players. Providing more opportunities for Kiwi players to experience international badminton is key. The players involved in this winning campaign learnt a lot through the experience, both on and off the court.

It was fantastic to follow the progress of our NZ Junior Badminton Team at the 2015 BWF World Junior Team Championships in Peru. The eight strong team represented New Zealand with pride and finished up with four losses (Korea 5-0, Denmark 5-0, Slovenia 3-2, Australia 3-2) and three wins (Venezuela 5-0, Chile 3-0, Dominican Republic 3-0) with a final placing of 29th out of 40 teams.

This is the first time in several years that NZ has had a team at this event and we are excited by the progress being made through our high performance programme. However this is a starting point and it is critical that we continue to build and push for better badminton performances on the world stage.

Other key highlights included Nina Kersten winning a Silver Medal in the Women's Doubles at the BWF Para-Badminton World Championships in England. This is a fantastic achievement in this new and exciting field of Para Badminton.

2016 will be an important year for our high performance players and coaches as we strive to continually improve and achieve better results. Partnerships with associations is critical to ensure we are working together for better performance outcomes.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the year ended 31 December 2015

1. STATEMENT OF GENERAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

REPORTING ENTITY

The New Zealand Badminton Federation Inc (the Federation) is incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 and is subject to the provisions of the Act.

These financial statements are general purpose financial statements and have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice.

The comparative figures provided in the financial statements are for the year ended 31 December 2014.

MEASUREMENT BASE

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on a historical cost basis are followed in these financial statements.

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

SPECIFIC ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and financial position have been applied.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts Receivable are stated at expected realisable value.

Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The 'first-in, first-out' basis of stock movement has been applied.

Foreign Currency

Transactions in foreign currencies are converted at the appropriate New Zealand rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Accounts Payable owing in foreign currencies are revalued at the appropriate rate of exchange at balance date.

Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Fixed Assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation at rates which are anticipated to write them off over their estimated useful lives. The rates used are :

Furniture and Fittings	8.5% Cost
Computer Equipment	33% Cost
Badminton Equipment	33% Cost
Website	30% Cost

Taxation

The Federation is an Amateur Sports Promoter and is exempt from income tax under section CW46 of the Income Tax Act 2007.

Goods and Services Tax

These statements are prepared on a GST exclusive basis, except for Accounts Receivable and Accounts Payable, which are recorded inclusive of GST.

Revenue

Revenue is recognised on an accrual basis. Grants and sponsorship are recognised when the conditions attached to the grants have been met, and have been utilised in accordance with those conditions.

Employee Entitlements

Provision has been made for Badminton NZ's liability for annual leave. The annual leave provision has been calculated on an actual accumulated entitlement basis at current rates of pay. This equates to the cash amount necessary to settle the obligation as at balance date.

Differential Reporting

The entity is not publicly accountable and is not large under defined criteria. It therefore qualifies for differential reporting in respect of accounting standards, and all appropriate exemptions have been applied.

CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in previous years.
